
Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking Policy

1. Policy Statement

Retro Reset Ltd is committed to preventing modern slavery and human trafficking in all areas of our work. Although we are a small, non-profit organisation, we recognise our responsibility to promote ethical practices and uphold human dignity in our operations and supply chains.

We have a zero-tolerance approach to modern slavery, forced labour, and human trafficking. We expect the same high standards from all our volunteers, partners, suppliers, and contractors.

2. Our Organisation

Retro Reset Ltd is a non-profit company limited by guarantee. We operate a mobile computing museum and deliver workshops to schools and community groups across the UK. We are powered by volunteers and supported by donations and grants.

Given our size and nature, we do not operate complex supply chains or engage in high-risk industries. However, we remain vigilant and proactive in assessing risks and promoting transparency.

3. Our Commitments

We are committed to:

- Ensuring our activities and supply chains are free from modern slavery and human trafficking;
- Acting ethically and with integrity in all our relationships;
- Raising awareness among staff and volunteers about modern slavery risks;
- Encouraging and enabling the reporting of concerns without fear of retaliation.

4. Due Diligence and Risk Management

We undertake the following due diligence:

- Working only with reputable suppliers and partners;
- Reviewing supplier policies and statements where relevant;
- Avoiding procurement from regions or sectors identified as high risk;
- Monitoring for signs of exploitation, especially in volunteer engagement and third-party services (e.g. cleaning, logistics).

As a small organisation, we assess risk proportionately and focus on high-impact areas, such as event contractors or donated equipment sources.

5. Volunteers and Safeguarding


While we do not employ paid staff, we apply safeguarding standards to our volunteer recruitment and engagement:


- All volunteers are recruited openly and fairly;
 - No volunteer is ever charged fees or asked for inappropriate commitments;
 - Volunteers are informed of their rights and are free to leave at any time;
 - We ensure an inclusive and respectful environment for all team members.

6. Reporting Concerns

- Regular updates where appropriate in our newsletters and team briefings.

We aim to build a culture of integrity, respect, and vigilance throughout our organisation.

8. Review and Responsibility

This policy is reviewed annually by the Board of Directors. The Directors are responsible for ensuring compliance, and may update this policy to reflect changes in our operations, risk profile, or legislation.
